ORDER


This matter having come before the Court by way of letters from counsel for the Samsung defendants dated July 22, 2004 and July 23, 2004, and a letter from counsel for MOSAID Technologies, Inc. ("MOSAID") dated July 22, 2004, and the Court having heard the arguments of counsel during a teleconference on July 29, 2004, and for the reasons stated on the record:

IT IS ON THIS 5th day of August, 2004

ORDERED that MOSAID's request to modify the discovery schedule is granted. The affirmative expert reports of MOSAID and the Samsung and Infineon parties shall now be served thirty days after Judge Martini rules on any appeal taken from the Court's rulings on sanctions against the Samsung defendants; all other existing scheduling dates in these consolidated cases being hereby vacated; and it is further

ORDERED that the Samsung defendants' request, that MOSAID be directed to identify by July 30, 2004 the DRAMs it contends are representative and the assumptions that it contends cannot be challenged by Samsung, is denied; and it is further

ORDERED that the Court shall defer ruling on the Samsung defendants' request that MOSAID identify immediately which patent claims it is asserting until after the appeal from the Court's rulings on sanctions against the Samsung defendants has been taken to Judge Martini.
